### President's Report By Keith Boecker

The GM unit had four retire on November 1st; Paul Grant, Cheryl McBey, Norman McClure and Elizabeth Robinson, there were two that retired as of September 1st;

Michael Kemper & Robert Young, as of October 1st GM unit had four retire, Johnny Carr, Gregory Gibson, Stacy Hughes and Brian Shafer. I would like to thank you for all your years of service and I hope you have a very happy and healthy retirement.

Terry Dittes, our UAW Vice President, gave information out at the UAW/GM Council meetings held on September 28-30th; there are 28,848 active UAW members at GM and at the date of the council meetings there were 9061 on layoff and 3902 on some type of leave. There are 5962 UAW Journeyperson with 68% eligible to retire. There are 408 apprentices at GM facilities. Terry Dittes stated over 400 temporary workers have been converted to full time since the 2019 agreement.

Frank Stuglin, our International Financial Secretary, stated in December of 2020 our strike fund balance was 790 million dollars and it projected with no major strikes we would reach 850 million in the second half of 2022 and at that time our dues will revert back to two hours dues. If after that point it falls below 650 million our dues will go back to 2.5 hours dues per month.

It was also relayed as a reminder if people have life changing events such as marriage, divorce or deaths to remember to update your beneficiaries. Each year individuals realize their beneficiaries are not who they intended after these events.

We heard Subcouncil reports from all Locals attending these meetings and speaking with other UAW locations everyone is dealing with the same issues as our location with not enough production and skilled workers and that General Motors is wanting to outsource work. I want to thank our local for allowing the GM Shop Committee and myself to attend these important Subcouncil meetings.

In December we will be taking nominations for the Guide, nominations will take place at the December 1st GM membership meetings, anyone from our units can contact the UAW office or anyone from the Executive Board to nominate a member. This is open to all active and retired members. We will update the membership when the election will be held. 
