The GM Unit had four retirements as of January 1st, Mike Hall, Janice Carpenter, Kevin Rittenhouse and Al Schlosser. Johns Manville unit had one retirement; Michelle

Stevens. February 1st GM unit had three retirements, Ray Miller, Jeff Smith and Al Niese, Powers and Sons unit had one retirement, Russ Walters and Herbert Orr unit had one, Steve Leatherman.

The GM unit had two retirements as of March 1st, Scott Harrington and Darrell Myers.

I would like to thank you for all your years of service and I hope you have a happy and healthy retirement.

The drawing for the Charlie Chatham Scholarship Awards was held on Wednesday February 22nd. I would like to congratulate the following; Alexander Vankham, Callie Seedorf, Alexus Miles, Gavin Askins and Abigail Stucker. I wish you success in your college education and would like to thank you for showing your interest in the scholarship progam.

February 2nd was the 7th year since the fatality of Terry Bodenbender at our GM plant. Thoughts are with the family of Terry and to all the families who lost someone at our facilities. Everyone please continue to work safely.

In the last couple of weeks we have had 30 employees return back to the Defiance GM plant. I would like to welcome them back and look forward to more returning in the future with our recent announcement and the start up of our new line this fall.

The International Strike Fund is at \$834,520,000. With several negotiations coming up in the near future we hope not to use the Strike Fund but if necessary it is nice to know that the fund is healthy. It was recently announced that the strike benefit was raised to \$500 from \$400.

The remodeling of the restrooms at the Memorial Hall are now complete.

We have recently increased the cost of the hall rentals. The cost for members for the Main Hall is now \$550 with a \$450 damage deposit which the member will get back if there is no damage to the hall. The cost for our members for the Memorial Hall is now \$400 with a \$350 damage deposit. These new prices went in effect as of January 1st.

Chad Cattell is now the new Servicing Representative for Powers and Sons unit due to the retirement of Brian Draper.

We are accepting resumes for a position of a groundskeeper at the UAW Hall. There is a posting of duties listed in this newsletter for anyone who is interested. Gary Brown has done this job for many years and has done an amazing job keeping up our grounds at the UAW Halls and park. He will be missed and I would like to thank Gary for all his hard work.

There was a Pre-retirement class held on February 27th, there were 64 employees from GM that signed up to attend this class.

Our Executive Board and Shop Chairman, Committeepersons and Alternate Committeepersons election will be held on May 11th; any run-off if necessary will be held on May 18th and the 25th at the same locations and times. Please look for the posting in this newsletter for dates, times and locations for this election. If anyone would like to know more about the positions for Executive Board, please feel free to ask myself or any of the board members for information.

Standing Committees will be opened for anyone who is interested after the General Election is complete. There are many committees that will be in need of people, information for this will be posted at a later date. If you want information on these committees please call the hall and Lisa will give you that information.

Thanks to the membership for allowing Rob Egnor, Tony Fairchild, Bob Gill and myself to attend the Skilled Trades Conference in Detroit. GM currently has 6400 skilled workers. Active we have 267 apprentices and GM owes us 260 more by the end of contract. We were informed that corporate profit was up 67% over the last two years; over 8 trillion since 2019. Average vehicle prices for GM was \$53,680.00, Ford was \$57,171.00 and Stellantis was \$56,000. EV's sold in the US in 2014 was under 1% of sales, in 2022 over 5% of sales. In Europe for 2022 12.1% of sales and China for 2022 is 22% of sales. The labor cost in making battery production is 4-7%

UAW Region 2B is offering an Online Academy; this is free for anyone that would like to take a class on line. The information has been posted on the boards. If you have any questions you can contact us at the hall at 419-784-5399. This is a great way to learn about the UAW and to get involved.

Chaiman's Report By Rob Egnor

Here at the plant we currently have 440 members on the rolls with 36 of our members on a leave. We did get some new folks in the plant recently,1 production

and 1 electrician from Toledo and 30production fromFt. Wayne. When you see these folks please take the time to welcome them to Local 211. We are still in need of skilled trades so if you know of anyone who may be interested in becoming an electrician, millwright or pattern maker please let us know. They can apply for openings on careers.gm.com or go through the STARC program to be placed on the apprentice list. Our Apprentice Chair here is Tony Fairchild and he will be more than happy to assist in guiding anyone through the process.

We recently had an announcement of an investment into our facility of 55 million dollars to make the Gen 6 blocks and to break into the EV future. As I have stated in all people meetings, just the Gen block business alone holds a place for approximately 270 team members here in Defiance. When some try to compare investment here to announcements at other locations they are comparing apples to oranges. We here in Defiance only need to get the tooling and programming to accommodate the changes needed to run the new block. When the business that some say are guaranteed replacement work ends up going to another location, the investment is going to be greatly increased to strip the new location and install all new machinery in that facility. Nothing in this business is a guarantee so I once again thank you, our members for continuing to do what we do best here in Defiance, make the best products for our customers.

To continue on with the commitment from our people, I want to take a minute to say an extra thank you for knocking this most recent GMS assessment out of the park. Three milestones were achieved out of this assessment and they were all credit to what our members do day in and day out. I appreciate what you all do to keep this place going in the right direction.

As always, thank you once again for being the hard working brothers and sister you have always been. Please be safe at what you do and remember to lock out your equipment.Take your time to make sure of your surroundings and do not let frustration allow you to make any mistakes.The vehicle parts that we make are in no way shape or form more important than your safety.
